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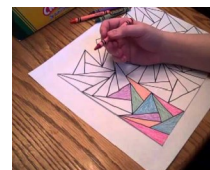

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Age 3 Preschool Art – Exploring Mediums and Techniques **For Ages 3-5**

Scope and Objectives:

To explore several mediums in art and have a ball doing it!

Text:

Preschool Art by MaryAnn Kohl, available new and used through amazon.

Background:

- 52 Weeks of Lessons
 - At age four we do art year round, fifty-two weeks. This corresponds with the *Slow and Steady* text used in the Beehive Early Childhood Curriculum.
- There are 2 lessons a week.
 - 39 lessons are on basics and are required.
 - 45 lessons are strictly YOUR CHOICE. You and your student get to pick what you will do.
 - 20 lessons are not assigned and are allotted for holidays as designated at the end of the syllabus.
- Scope and Sequence
 - Kohl has over 230 art projects in the areas of drawing, painting, clay, construction, collage, crafts and sculpture.
 - After the 41 Basics, YOU and your child get to choose what you do!
- Ease of Use
 - Kohl has made it very easy to use the book through the use of icons which state age, preparation time, whether the child will need help, cautions and her favorites.
 - Materials lists and complete instructions included.
 - She also has projects arranged by the time of year, starting in September.
- After completing the Basics
 - YOU can start with the month or season you are in and go from there.
 - Ideas for Holiday art are attached at the end of this syllabus.
 - Insert holidays as they come-up during the year. Only 84 lessons are to be from the book.

Format:

- 2 lessons a week.
 - One for the first 41 weeks is mandatory.
 - The other lesson is either YOUR CHOICE from the many others in the book, or a holiday art project.

LOOK AHEAD so you know what is coming-up in the required projects, and also for what you may choose to do. Gather your supplies and be prepared. It is best to plan out the Art projects about four weeks ahead.
